Let's explore Post Boxes

You will need:

- Pen
- Paper
- Tape measure

There are post boxes in your local community. These are known as street furniture.

There should be a Royal Mail post box within ½ mile of your home. Take yourself on a walk (supervised as necessary) and see how many you can find within a 30-minute walk from your house.

Try walking in a few directions.

At each post box you find, make some notes about what you see. Think about and make notes on:

- Shape
- Whether it is a pillar, wall or lamp post box.
- The size how tall?
- The collection dates and times.
- How big a letter could you post through the slot?
- Also look closely at the design of each one. What do you notice?

Britain's oldest Post Box is 161 years old.

Research how you can tell how old a post box is?

Record all your findings and share them with me.

1 hour of CU Learning

Make a Mechanical Hand

You will need:

- Paper or card
- Straws
- Glue or tape
- Wool, string, cord
- Scissors
- 1: Draw around your hand onto a piece of paper or card.
- 2: Cut this hand shape out. Cut a little bigger than the outline.
- 3: Mark your finger and thumb joints on the cut out. Notice that you have three joints on each finger/thumb.
- 4: Next draw straight lines across the joint or curve them slightly.
- 5: Fold the fingers and thumbs at all the lines.
- 6: Cut the straws slightly shorter than each of your finger joints.
- 7: Tape or glue the straws to the hand.
- 8: Thread some wool/string through each finger. Each finger will have its own piece of wool/string. Each of these threads will move a different finger or thumb.
- 9: Finally, thread all the strings through one straw that tape to the wrist on your mechanical hand.
